<b>plant</b>	A living thing that uses sunlight to make its own food. Plants grow in the ground or in water.	Plants are living things that grow, usually in the ground. They include grasses, trees, bushes, ferns and mosses.						
<b>wild</b>	Living naturally, not planted by people.							
<b>common</b>	Easily found and in large numbers.							
<b>garden</b>	An area of land used to grow flowers, lawns or fruits and vegetables.							
<b>evergreen</b>	A tree or plant with green leaves that stay on all year.	<b>Deciduous</b>	<b>Evergreen</b>					
<b>deciduous</b>	A tree or plant that drops its leaves and then regrows them each year.	A plant with leaves that drop off each year.	A tree, bush, or other plant with leaves that remain green throughout the year.					
<b>seeds</b>	The tiny parts of a plant that develop into new plants	Oaks and maples are deciduous trees.	Pine and fir trees are common evergreens.					
<b>fruit</b>	The part of a plant that has seeds such as an apple or strawberry. Most fruits are sweet and can be eaten.			<b>Oak</b>	<b>Ash</b>	<b>Maple</b>		
<b>vegetable</b>	A plant or part of a plant which is used for food, such as carrots, beans, or lettuce.							
<b>underground</b>	Beneath the earth's surface. Carrots and potatoes grow underground.
